As such, a LAN does not collect information directly from the public. However, personnel with the GCMC Registrar Office coordinates the collection of information from 10 or more members of the public that is stored in paper format and/or MCNET via the Regional Center Persons/Activity Management System (RCPAMS). RCPAMS is currently operating under OMB approval - 201603-0704-005, and an update to its current OMB approval is forthcoming.
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
